


FLEET

HPD has fourteen vehicles in the fleet. Most are driven primarily for patrol functions. HPD traditionally buys two squads per year to keep the fleet in good working order. Squads are replaced around 90,000 miles to protect against costly repairs. Officers logged 207,832 miles in 2024.

His primary focus is the high school, but his services extend to the middle school and elementery school as needed. Officer Salo handles our juvenile investigations as well.

You will see Officer Salo and other officers monitoring sporting events. This is to promote our involvement in the community and keep the peace, should any disturbances occur. You will also see officers frequent the school area in the mornings and afternoons to ensure the safety of our students as they arrive and depart.

D.A.R.E. has been a very successful and rewarding program for the Hermantown Middle School 5th graders. Officer Salo graduated from his D.A.R.E. Instructor course in the spring! He looks forward to teaching the course during the 2nd semester of the school year!

On November 2, 2024 K9 Jack assisted officers in locating a male wanted for domestic assault. The male had fled a hotel prior to officers' arrival into a wooded area. K9 Jack was deployed and announcements given with no response. K9 Jack immediately picked up a track which led into the woods and thick brush. K9 Jack began showing behavioral changes indicating he was close to human scent and quickly located the male hiding motionless under a pile of brush. The male was taken into custody without further incident.

In June, Sgt. Pfeiffer and Sgt. Pernu took part in the USPCA Regional Trials in Hudson, WI. K9 Tuuko and K9 Jack joined up with Duluth PD K9 Villi and Eveleth PD K9 Bear to compete as a regional team representing northeastern Minnesota. After two days of events, they came out on top with a 1st place finish as Top Regional Team at trials.




K9 STATS

Police dogs are used to find hidden evidence and narcotics, track suspects and lost people, participate in community policing activities, and protect officers in dangerous situations.




In addition to responding to calls, our K9 Officers, Tuuko and Jack, logged over 300 hours of training.



INVESTIGATIONS



The responsibility of the Detective Bureau is to follow up on cases that did not reach disposition by our patrol officers. Traditionally, these are more complex cases that require time and extensive follow-up to solve.






DRUG RELATED ARRESTS




